


AHS Southern Region Harptoberfest



On Sunday, October 25, 2020, the Southern Region of the American Harp Society held its first-ever regional event hosted by Southern Regional Director, Sarah K. Crocker. The Harptoberfest event was held virtually over Zoom with about 40 people in attendance - many dressed in festive fall costumes - and served as a rally for our members on the Gulf Coast who have recently suffered multiple hurricanes in a row. Hailing from southern Louisiana, the Southern Region's own Quintessential Duo, Catherine Anderson and Rebecca Todaro, were the featured performers for the event. They opened the event with Handel's "Arrival of the Queen of Sheba" from Solomon arranged by Catherine Anderson for two harps and closed the event with Albeniz's Granada from *Suite Española*, Op. 47 arranged for two harps by Maite Etcheverry. Attendees were introduced to each chapter and its officers, and then learned about programs and resources that the American Harp Society offers to its chapters. In Memoriam: Brook Boddie (October 29, 1968-July 15, 2020)

Nelson Brook Boddie graduated from Caddo Magnet High School and went on to study at both Northwestern State University and Louisiana State University-Shreveport, where he completed his Masters Degree. He served as Assistant Director of Disability Services for the state of Louisiana, Organist and Principal Accompanist for Broadmoor Baptist Church, and as an Adjunct Professor of English at LSU-S.

Brook learned about life, faith and music from his two grandmothers, Dot and Memommy. He had an interest in music from a young age and was known to bang around on his grandmother's piano as a small child. He loved music and embraced the challenge of learning to play a new instrument. While participating in music mission trips with Broadmoor Baptist and Louisiana Baptist All State Choir, Brook influenced thousands of students. He was also an accomplished composer and had many published pieces for the harp. As a tributes to him, his pieces were played by harpists around the world the week of his passing.

A Memorial Service celebrating Brook's life was held at 4:00 PM on Saturday, July 18, 2020 in Worship Center North, Broadmoor Baptist Church, Shreveport. The service was also live-streamed on the church's Facebook page. Boldachev Concert and Dinner Social – September 13th, 2019




