2023 CHAPTER AMBASSADOR AWARDS

Ellie Choate is a versatile harpist based in Long Beach, California. She performs in chamber, opera, and symphony organizations throughout Southern and Central California. She regularly concertizes as a collaborative artist, and with her Duo Pangelica partner, Jacquelyn Venter. Ellie's career spans work in commercial music, with performances on and off camera in motion pictures, television, sound recordings, and concerts with headline artists. Ellie has produced five solo CDs of her pop and jazz stylings, Christmas, and Inspirational music, and published arrangements for harp ensemble. She serves the American Harp Society both locally and nationally, and is on the applied music faculty of CSU Long Beach and UC Irvine.

AHS 25TH NATIONAL COMPETITION COORDINATORS

Director: JoAnn Turovsky is principal harpist with the Los Angeles Opera Orchestra, the Los Angeles Chamber Orchestra, and the Los Angeles Master Chorale Orchestra. She is the professor of harp at the Thornton School of Music at the University of Southern California, the Colburn Conservatory, the Colburn School of Performing Arts and Music Academy of the West in Santa Barbara. Ms. Turovsky appears frequently as soloist with musical organizations throughout California and is busy in the motion picture and television industry. John Williams has written a solo piece for harp that she performed on the Angela's Ashes sound track. Her spare time is happily devoted to being outsmarted by her Australian Shepherd, Reggie and five equally busy cats. Ms. Turovsky won both the Intermediate II and Young Professional divisions of the American Harp Society, Inc. National Competition in the stone ages and has been Chairman of the Competition since 1981.

Administrator: Caroline Wilkins was the 2019-2021 touring Concert Artist of the American Harp Society after winning first prize in the prestigious national competition. As such, she frequently presents recitals and masterclasses throughout the United States and Canada. She currently serves as administrator of the AHS National Competition. Caroline Wilkins also won the 2018 Concerto Competition at the Music Academy of the West in her third summer as a fellow. As an orchestral harpist, she has performed as Principal Harpist for the American Youth Symphony, the Debut Chamber Orchestra, the USC Symphony, and has been a substitute for the New World Symphony. She has performed in venues such as the Walt Disney Concert Hall under the baton of Gustavo Dudamel, Esa-Pekka Salonen, James Conlon, and Alan Gilbert. Also a classically trained pianist, she has been studying classical piano from the age of five, and maintains a robust teaching studio of both harp and piano students. Caroline graduated in 2019 from the University of Southern California Thornton School of Music with a Masters degree in harp performance.

INSTRUMENT SECURITY

Institute registrants are welcome to keep personal harps in their hotel room or dormitory, where practicing is allowed within reasonable hours. Competitors and Institute performer/presenters may store their harps in the Harp Pen in the Olive Rehearsal Hall (OP231). Space in the Harp Pen may be available on a limited basis for personal instrument storage. The Harp Pen will be secure, monitored, and/or locked 24 hours a day.

Harpists loaning instruments to the Institute and/or Competition must sign a liability release form and receive a registration tag for their harp. Neither the AHS nor the Coburn School provides insurance for any harps, nor are they liable for damages that may occur while at the Institute. Harps will be registered, labeled, and moved to the Harp Pen by their owner unless prior arrangements have been made with the Harp Pen Coordinator. All instruments and equipment must be removed from the Harp Pen no later than 3 pm on Sunday, June 4th.

All compositions in all divisions must be performed by memory. All repeats optional except where stated otherwise.




SMOKING & ALCOHOL


The Colburn School is a dry and smoke-free campus. All alcohol products and smoking of any kind are prohibited.

DRUGS & WEAPONS
















CAMPUS MAP

PROGRAM NOTES

Odyssée Op. 37 for solo harp

"Odyssée" was composed and written in 1990 for Lizotte's bachelor recital, and is her first solo harp composition – influenced by some favorites in the harp repertoire written by harpist composers, such as Tournier and Salzedo. Also inspired by the Homer's stories, the work opens on several tableaux and adventures, and a reexposition that gradually brings us back to reality - making us realize that this whole journey was a pure imagination. « Odyssée » was nominated among the winning works for the American Harp Society Composition Contest in 2010.

Suite Galactique Op. 39 for solo harp

Exosphère – Hymne au Bon Combat – Scherzo del Pueblo

A pure, timeless, and free-spirited composition, "Suite Galactique" was composed during the summer of 2000. In addition to exploring new sonic aspects on the harp, it requires harpists to expand their technical skills and control sounds from other sources. The harpist needs to play between the tuning pin and the bridge pin, play while holding a piece of paper on a vibrating string, imitating the tonal intensity of cold and fire, in addition to playing while simultaneously imitating a mermaid's song... playing while singing! "Suite Galactique" was also a required piece for the American Harp Society's Anne Adams Award in 2016.

Stellar Sonata Op. 51 for electroacoustic harp

Andare Moderato - Ricercare - Radioso Sono

Composed in 2019 with support from the Conseil des arts et des lettres du Québec, Les Pays-d'en-Haut RCM and Camac Harps, "Stellar Sonata" is the musical and emotional extension of "Stellae Saltantem" op. 49 for acoustic and electric harp commissioned by the Atlantic Harp Duo in 2014. The entire sonata develops themes and images that represent three characters from the Ancient Greek mythology: the Minotaur, Ariadne and god Bacchus. Even if the work is composed specifically for an electroacoustic

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harp, the first movement has no real-time interactions with electronics and can be played on an acoustic harp. It can therefore be presented independently of the other two movements, as for example in a competition. On the other hand, the 2nd and 3rd movements highlight the great virtues of the electroacoustic harp. The exploration of effects spread over independent registers as well as their control in concert offer a double virtuosity for the performer and a particularly interesting vision for the listener. Whether you consider the work to be of a harpist or an angel, the introduction of bar chimes, the daring interplay of electronic sound, and the apparition of Ariadne's ghost in real-time profoundly transport us to the infinity of the soul!

La Madone Op. 43 – Lullaby for harp solo

Commissioned by harpist Valérie Milot in 2009, La Madone is a love song that depicts the contemplation of the mother with child. La Madone allows the performer to play almost as if he or she would improvise. It sounds like a free style piece, like if it would be written for a foggy jazz trio at the corner of a club: vocal, piano and double bass, but all this on the harp! With both the creakings of the bass strings produced by the disc's mechanism that produce esoteric sounds, and the ascending and descending patterns of the arpeggios, we may perceive the gratings of the old wooden rocking chair as we may easily imagine the mother cradling her child and singing lullabies. Her words are sometimes soft, sometimes stressful, and at the same time filled with weariness and admiration. The mother ends up putting her baby asleep in the softness of the harmonic sounds, and in the bliss of belonging to each other.



PERFORMERS and PRESENTERS



GREG ADAMSON

Like most musicians, Greg Adamson wears many hats; cellist, composer, conductor, and educator. He has performed worldwide, in such diverse venues as Vatican City, Disney Hall, Hollywood Bowl, and Radio City Music Hall, to name but a few. He has performed with a broad range of artists including James Taylor,

John Williams, Rod Stewart, Yo Yo Ma, Dr. Dre, Glenn Campbell, The Who, Guns 'n Roses, and Elton John, and has been seen on numerous occasions performing on the MTV Music Awards as well as the American Music Awards. Greg is Principal Cellist for the La Mirada (CA) Symphony.




PEI-SAN CHIU (FORMOSA TRIO)

She's an advocate for both lever harp and traditional/contemporary Scottish music and works to spread awareness and access to the lever harp.



CHRISTOPHER GARCIA Christopher Garcia is a composer, percussionist, multi-instrumentalist and improviser who continues to garner critical accolades and popular acclaim with over 1200 performances

in 28 countries on 5 continents. Musical collaborations continue with either drum set, percussion of north and south India, indigenous instruments of Mexico/Mesoamerica, or marimba as a featured soloist in classical western chamber and symphonic music, and/or classical Indian music, as well as composing and concertizing in Avant Garde, jazz, Mexican indigenous or folkloric, rock, and world music settings with an eclectic variety of who's who collaborators in music, dance, film, poetry, and multimedia



TASHA SMITH GODINEZ

Tasha Smith Godinez is a musician based in San Diego, California. She is passionate about augmenting the harp repertoire and has dedicated her career to commissioning, performing, and recording new music. Tasha holds a BM

and MM from San Diego State University and a performance diploma from the Ecole Normale de Musique de Paris, Alfred Cortot.

Her label, Ennanga Records & Publishing, offers new harp sheet music and recordings. In 2022, Tasha released two albums: "Metamorphoses" (Centaur Records), an album of six new pieces for harp solo, and "Out of the Desert" (Ennanga Records), recorded with collaborating musicians, Domenico Hueso and Christopher Garcia, both gained international acclaim.



Passionate about creating new music

for harp, Linda-Rose Hembreiker is continuously working with composers and arrangers. Pieces she has premiered include: Chapman Welch's Four Pieces For Solo Harp and Stratosphere Exit Scenarios, Jame's Worlton's

LINDA-ROSE HEMBREIKER



FUNG HO

Maestro Fung Ho is the Music Director and Conductor of the Olympia Philharmonic Orchestra and the Olympia Youth Orchestra in the Greater Los Angeles area. He has made appearances as guest conductor for performances at USC and CSULA.

Fung Ho was President of the Los Angeles Section of the American String Teachers Association and also President of the West San Gabriel Valley Branch of the Music Teachers Association of California. Mr. Ho holds a Masters Degree of Music in Violin Performance from the Manhattan School of Music in New York City where he studied with the late Carroll Glenn.

Fung Ho is also on the faculty of the Los Angeles County High School for the Arts. In 2001, he was invited by the Hong Kong Government to be the guest conductor at the Hong Kong Youth Music Camp. Mr. Ho has also given violin masterclasses in the US as well as the Far East. Many of his prize-winning students have gone on to further their musical studies in music conservatories all over the country. Ho was recognized as the Outstanding Studio Teacher of the Year by the Los Angeles Chapter of the American String Teachers Association.



CHEN-YU HUANG (FORMOSA TRIO)

The members of the trio are flutist Pei-San Chiu (associate professor at Taiwan Tung-Hai University), violist Tze-Ying Wu (assistant professor at University of Kentucky), and harpist Chen-Yu Huang

(assistant professor at Michigan State University). They have performed and given workshops in the U.S., Taiwan, and China. In 2018, they were invited to perform two world premieres at the World Harp Congress in Hong Kong. Their first album, First Impression, was released in 2018 and received great reviews. The trio seeks to bring variety into the literature and started to commission composers and arrange music since 2017. Their arrangements are published with HappyString Music.



DOMENICO HUESO

Nico has recorded from Nashville to Los Angeles. Hueso also has the knack for improvising and playing off-the-cuff. Hueso also has toured extensively throughout Latin America, the Caribbean, Europe,

and Asia. Tours include orchestral & chamber performances along with accompanying Plácido Domingo & crooner Johnny Mathis. Hueso has performed with principal players of the New York Philharmonic, Chicago Symphony, San Diego Symphony, Puerto Rico symphony, LA Philharmonic. Rock bands such as KANSAS, DISTURBED and Steven Tyler of Aerosmith and also with composer Ramin Djawadi of GAME OF THRONES Live in Concert. In 2019 Hueso was asked to aid with Yo-Yo Ma's Bach Project in Puerto Rico.

Culture. She also performs with the New York Philharmonic, the Louisiana Philharmonic. and the Harlem Chamber Players. Her debut solo album Ennanga explores spirituals and their influence on other forms of American musical expression.

Dr. Jackson is currently an Assistant Professor and the Director of Undergraduate Studies for the Music Department at Hunter College. She holds degrees from The Juilliard School (DMA) and Yale University (MM and BA).



JULIA KAY JAMIESON

Julia Kay Jamieson is an energetic performer, dedicated teacher, innovative composer and award-winning harpist. Julia has been a featured concert artist, clinician and composer for events

including the Canadian International Summer Harp Institute, the Festival de Cuerdas in Puerto Rico, and the Illinois Summer Harp Class. An advocate for new music, she is chair of the American Harp Society Young Composers Project, is the principal harpist of the Cleveland Chamber Symphony, and has been commissioned to write several harp ensemble pieces. She has given improvisation, arranging, and creative teaching workshops throughout the US and Canada.



DANIELLE KUNTZ

As a new music harpist, **Danielle Kuntz** is dedicated to bringing new music to life. Danielle believes that the longevity of the classical music industry relies on living composers. She has focused her career on connecting these composers with new audiences by commissioning them and

performing their music. Danielle also works to make the harp a more accessible instrument for composers through lectures, workshops, and individual instruction. She is also the harpist and Marketing Director of the Midwest-based new music ensemble The____Experiment. Danielle holds degrees from the University of North Texas and is currently based in Ann Arbor, Michigan.



CATHERINE LITAKER

Catherine Yom Litaker is an avid soloist, chamber musician and orchestral harpist. She has performed on countless stages all across the globe including Western Europe, South America, North America and Asia. She currently performs as a freelance harpist in and around Los Angeles, CA. She has always been active in

performing chamber music and is a founding member of the Chicago Harp Quartet; a dynamic group aiming to expand the repertoire and exposure of the harp by bringing a high level of unique harp chamber music to the stage.



Canadian harpist and composer, Caroline Lizotte is internationally renowned as one of the leading harp composers. Having received commissions from harpists around

the world, her works have been widely performed, recorded, and used in competitions. She is dedicated to sharing her art through her creations, editions, mentoring, concerts, and the recording of her entire works. Caroline recently produced her first album Lizotte Plays Lizotte, and she is currently working on her next opus for harp and violin, commissioned by Lori Gemmell and Etsuko Kimura with support from the Canada Council for the Arts. Caroline Lizotte is also a harp professor at the University of Montreal's Faculty of Music.

WILLI HUBER MAERZ



Willi Maerz studied piano, arrangement and harmonics of jazz in Munich. His great interest is in the harp ensemble, for which he published around 100 arrangements and compositions in various musical styles and technical grades. Willi's music

is regularly performed at many famous Universities (Royal College of Music, London; Music University of Vienna; Music Academy of Prague; Conservatories of Innsbruck and Salzburg; University of Arizona, Tucson)

Willi Maerz was invited as a lecturer to many important Harp Festivals, like: AHS National Conference 2018 and 2024; AHS Summer Institute 2013; WHC 2022; Singapore Harp Festival 2022



LES MARSDEN Though thoroughly trained as a musician from age four, Les Marsden made his name as a professional actor, director and playwright. At age 21, he created his one-man show

A Night at Harpo's, complete with harp solos and widow Susan Marx's blessings. His show was booked internationally; his harp was formerly Mildred Dilling's instrument, which she told Marsden was Harpo's favorite of her collection. Based in New York and London, his highly-varied 4,000-performance career highlight was a nomination for London's Laurence Olivier Award. At 42, he suffered a disabling onstage injury while starring in Washington, DC and retired, moving his family to the Yosemite region. In 2002 he created the Mariposa Yosemite Symphony Orchestra, serving as CEO, Music Director, Conductor and Composer/Arranger. Tiny Mariposa is considered America's smallest town with its own orchestra, which is also the only orchestra allowed to perform in Yosemite National Park in the park's 133-year history.



MUSIC BEYOND BORDERS

Musicians Tasha Smith Godinez, Domenico Hueso and Christopher Garcia bring a unique sound to the stage as "Music Beyond Borders". The trio instrumentation includes harp (acoustic and electric), viola,

electric bass, western percussion, percussion of both north and south India and ancient Meso-American cultures. They create a new and mesmerizing musical experience.



OLYMPIA YOUTH ORCHESTRA

The Olympia Youth Orchestra, based in Arcadia, California, is open to all students ages 12 & up through annual competitive auditions. The ensemble, run by the non-profit Olympia Philharmonic Society, offers two free public performances per season at the San Gabriel Mission Playhouse.



ALFREDO ROLANDO ORTIZ

World renowned soloist of the Paraguayan harp, a composer, author, teacher and recording artist, Alfredo Rolando Ortiz considers his "most important concert" playing in the delivery room during the birth of his second daughter. He has

recorded over 40 albums and is the winner of a Gold Record in South America. Author of several books of harp music, his compositions are frequently performed and recorded by pedal, lever and folk harpists and ensembles and some are required study at harp departments of universities and conservatories around the world. He has offered lectures, workshops for harpists and recitals at many harp events, including the AHS National Conference and the World Harp Congress.



JACQUELINE POLLAUF lacqueline Pollauf is known for her sensitive performances and dedication to teaching. Past performances include a premiere at Carnegie Hall, and appearances at

the Eleventh World Harp Congress and the National Gallery of Art. Her recent duo recording, Beau Soir, was lauded as "utter perfection" (The Harp Column).

PERFORMERS and PRESENTERS

Jacqueline performs frequently as a recitalist in programs drawing on repertoire standards, little-known works, and her own transcriptions. Her compositional works are available through Lvon and Healy Publications and Oakway Studios.

Jacqueline is on faculty at the Baltimore School for the Arts, the University of Maryland, Baltimore County and maintains a highly regarded YouTube channel. She holds degrees from the Peabody Conservatory.



AMELIA P. ROMANO

Amelia Romano plays music from Latin American as well as jazz and classical, but her music defines its own path.

Having completed an MM in Classical Lever Harp Performance under the tutelage of Karen Gottlieb, Amelia is an active soloist in addition to offering workshops and virtual seminars on lever-

shifting and adapting cross-genre works for the lever harp from classical to folk, jazz to Latin. This Fall she will release an album containing audio recordings of select works from her 5 recital programs performed during her masters.



ARI SCHWARTZ

Ariel Sol "Ari" Bertulfo Schwartz (2000) is at the cutting edge of musical arts as a harpist, composer, and producer. He facilitates community through artistic vulnerability and strives to diversify the stage and audience, dismantling

traditional accessibility barriers via innovative programming.

Ari graduated in 2023 from the Jacobs School of Music in Bloomington, Indiana with bachelor degrees in harp and composition as well as minors in math, ethnomusicology, and electronic music. Winner of the 7th USA International Harp Competition Ruth Inglefield Composition Contest and recent Young Artist in Residence on American Public Media's "Performance Today," Ari synthesizes his experiences and identities into a genredefying, multimedia approach to contemporary music.



KRISTAL SCHWARTZ

Kristal Schwartz is a San Francisco-Bay Area harpist, experienced educator, harp entrepreneur, dynamic harp ensemble director, and performer with over twentyfive years of achievements. She holds a Masters Degree in Performance from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, distinguished with honors. Kristal is the

owner and founder of Bay Area Harp & Music Academy. Her involvement in the community reaches far - she is the founder and director of the SJYS Ensemble and a music professor at West Valley College. ANNE SULLIVAN

Harpist Anne Sullivan began her concert career at age twelve when she appeared twice as soloist with the Philadelphia Orchestra. She is known nationally as a recitalist and chamber musician and has released solo and chamber music recordings. In 2012, she founded Harp Mastery®, an online resource which now serves a worldwide community of

harpists. Her creative approaches to teaching focus on helping harpists of all ages achieve harp happiness, which she defines as "playing the music you want the way you want." Through her podcast, online courses, challenges, live events, and proprietary coaching process, Harp Mastery® continues to empower harpists to find fulfillment and joy in their harp playing.



MIA THEODORATUS

Mia Theodoratus is a curious and adventurous creator of sound using harps, lyres and electronics. Her work takes her to playing Art Basil in Miami, LifeBall in Vienna, The Acropolis and punk venues in NYC. She has been invited to play for

President Obama, composed for Flight of the Conchords, done the Whitney Biennial and played at MoMa.



PHALA TRACY

Phala Tracy teaches Suzuki harp and music theory at Studio Fidicina in Minneapolis, MN and she is adjunct professor of harp at Gustavus Adolphus College. She teaches at summer Suzuki

Institutes across the country and she is a Suzuki harp teacher trainer. Phala plays and sings with Matt Wilson and His Orchestra

and Follow the Firefly and she is an active arranger, composer, improviser and performer in the Twin Cities. She has released a whimsical collection of "Critter Songs," published four volumes of "Songs for Sight Reading"; and she is developing an evergrowing curriculum of "Music Theory in Song and Rhyme."



JACQUELYN VENTER

Jacquelyn Venter is an active performer whose performance has been described as "lovely, meditative, and exquisitely played." 
NATE ZEISLER
